




Venue Location



Great for history and wildlife

Within sight of Canary Wharf and with the O2 Arena an iconic backdrop the old East India Dock Basin now enjoys a new lease of life as a wildlife sanctuary. During the 19th Century ships delivered their cargoes here, now it's a site of tranquil open water and a small wild flower meadow amongst the concrete jungle of Canary Wharf. The site also boasts the most westerly piece of saltmarsh along the river Thames. It provides a piece of rare green open space in the heart of London right next to the River Thames.

Projects which adoption may go towards will be replacing bird hides, new Common Tern breeding rafts, habitat works on the saltmarsh or restoration of some of the historic features of the site.

Facilities

- Marquee can be erected onsite
- Limited onsite car parking can be arranged if required
