

Build on tradition of using land (Leyton Marshes) and facilities (Ice Centre) for art works and performances and create a specific enhanced area to support and facilitate outdoor events




Established leisure facilities to be improved and upgraded to better accommodate learning activities and events



Thematic Proposals Landscape and Heritage

To be read in conjunction with the Area 2 Proposals Consolidated proposals by sub-area

Landscape

- Landscape Investment Area Fragmented landscape in need of major investment To include development of waterside leisure facility at Thames Water Depot and decontamination and opening up of the infilled oxbow to north
- Landscape Enhancement Area Currently a mixture of weak or unrecognisable landscape with some features in need of significant enhancement and strengthening
- Landscape Conservation Area Currently strong landscape. Openness and character of recreational spaces and local parks to be protected
- Impact of major highways through and alongside the Regional Park to be reduced through appropriate planting and maintenance of green road frontages, and maintenance of views into the Park
- Opening up selective views up and down the valley from Lea Bridge Road
- Industry and business parks to be encouraged to improve landscape and boundary treatments examine further screening of areas of housing and industry to maximise green edge to the Park
- The upkeep and appearance of pockets of residential development within the Park to be maintained to a high standard
- Landscape features and new signage developed to create a new Park gateway


Heritage

Thematic Proposals Environment



To be read in conjunction with the Area 2 Proposals Consolidated proposals by sub-area

Water



Water quality to be improved to meet standards for immersion water sports and enhance biodiversity. Address sources of water pollution and support wider partnership work in relation to ongoing improvement of water quality, flood management, waste water management



Explore opportunities with Environment Agency to remove/mitigate existing barriers to access on flood relief channel and open access through Walthamstow Reservoirs from Walthamstow



Improve flood relief channel including enhancing biodiversity and increasing flood water capacity



Explore opportunities to enhance and support commercial use of Navigation and investigate possible locations for working wharves



Areas that could be explored for additional flood storage amongst other uses

Energy and Waste



Excellent energy efficiency at all facilities should be strived for and any new development within the Park to be of the highest standards of energy efficiency – likewise all facilities should minimise waste generation and reuse and recycle waste as a resource

Production



Consider opportunities at Wick Wood for wood biomass production and whether arisings from ground maintenance of Marshes in this area can contribute to a biomass energy resource

Land



Support local authorities in the management of allotments/community gardens and work to maintain facilities with special attention focused on improving the edges of plots and boundaries shared with the Park



Development of waterside leisure facility at Thames Water Depot and decontamination and opening up of the infilled oxbow to north
