A Member expressed concern that the report gave the impression that the Trust was not managing its finances.

Members considered that tabling of the letter from the Trust did not provide sufficient time for debate and robust decision making and therefore consideration of sending a letter to the Trust expressing concern should be deferred to the next meeting when 2018/19 Q1 performance would be reviewed. The Trust Managing Director/Finance Director apologised for tabling the letter but the Trust Board had met only the day before.
